PRESIDENT, CHI St. LUKE'S HEALTH SUGAR LAND HOSPITAL

ROBERT A. HEIFNER has been serving in the role of President of CHI St. Luke's Health-Sugar Land Hospital since July, 2012. Under his tenure the average daily census has improved by 20 percent. He successfully built the Sugar Land Doctors Group by recruiting physicians and building a primary care base for Sugar Land. He opened the St. Luke's Sugar Land Women's Center in 2012, resulting in the growth of Women's Services by 30 percent. Cardiology and Cath Lab volumes have increased 45 percent in two years, and in 2012, the hospital was awarded the NRC Picker "Path to Excellence" for most improved hospital in Patient Experience.

Prior to joining CHI St. Luke's, Heifner served for three years as Chief Executive Officer of Mainland Medical Center, a 223-bed acute care hospital located in Texas City, Texas. He successfully managed a merger with Clear Lake Regional Medical Center and integrated medical staffs and boards of trustees under one set of bylaws. He also created a Community Advisory Board to strengthen the hospital's relationship with the community.

During his tenure at Mainland Medical Center, Heifner made significant strides in clinical service line development, including increased outpatient revenue and inpatient referrals with the development of a new occupational medicine program. He also opened an emergency express care clinic, an intermediate care unit, and developed a thoracic surgery program.

Heifner's community involvement includes serving on the boards of directors for the Fort Bend Economic Development Council, Ovarcome, Inc., Texas City/LaMarque Chamber of Commerce, Galveston County Salvation Army, and Galveston County Health District. He also served on Boy Scouts of America Bay-Area Council Executive Board of Directors and is a member of the Sugar Land Rotary Club. He is a Fellow of American Healthcare Executives, completed a Master of Healthcare Administration at Tulane University, and earned a Master of Business Administration and a Bachelor of Science from Louisiana Tech University.
